

## **Sunday 31st May 2020 Pentecost**

Jesus Christ, whom we worship, is our crucified, risen and ascended Lord and we have walked with him through his journey of love.

- We have faced the agony of his suffering and death on a cross.

- We have rejoiced at his bursting free from the bonds of death.

- We have enjoyed his risen presence with us and his revelation of himself through the breaking of bread.

- We have seen his return to the throne before which every knee shall bow and every tongue confess that this Jesus is Lord.

And now, with the followers of his own time, we await the coming of the promised Holy Spirit, his gift to his people, through whom we make Christ known to the world.

### **The Pentecost Reading. Acts of the Apostles (2.1-13) NIV**

**2** When the day of Pentecost came, they were all together in one place. **2** Suddenly a sound like the blowing of a violent wind came from heaven and filled the whole house where they were sitting. **3** They saw what seemed to be tongues of fire that separated and came to rest on each of them. **4** All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues as the Spirit enabled them.

**5** Now there were staying in Jerusalem God-fearing Jews from every nation under heaven. **6** When they heard this sound, a crowd came together in bewilderment, because each one heard their own language being spoken. **7** Utterly amazed, they asked: "Aren't all these who are speaking Galileans?"

**8** Then how is it that each of us hears them in our native language? **9** Parthians, Medes and Elamites; residents of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, **10** Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya near Cyrene; visitors from Rome **11** (both Jews and converts to Judaism); Cretans and Arabs—we hear them declaring the wonders of God in our own tongues!” **12** Amazed and perplexed, they asked one another, “What does this mean?” **13** Some, however, made fun of them and said, “They have had too much wine.”

This is the word of the Lord. **Thanks be to God.**

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to John.  
**Glory to you, O Lord.**

**John 7:37-39      NIV**

**37** On the last and greatest day of the festival, Jesus stood and said in a loud voice, “Let anyone who is thirsty come to me and drink. **38** Whoever believes in me, as Scripture has said, rivers of living water will flow from within them.” **39** By this he meant the Spirit, whom those who believed in him

were later to receive. Up to that time the Spirit had not been given, since Jesus had not yet been glorified.

This is the Gospel of the Lord. **Praise to you, O Christ.**

## **Sermon**

OK, so maybe we don't walk around with our heads on fire (as one child described Pentecost to me!) but we can - and we should pray for the Spirit to come on us too - pray to be filled with the Holy Spirit.

What words should we use - well it doesn't really matter because the Lord reads and understands the prayers already written on our hearts before we ever form them into words - but maybe something like:

*Heavenly Father, I choose your Son Jesus Christ to be my Lord and Saviour. I choose to follow him. And as I repent of my sins and empty myself of all that is not of you, I ask you to fill me with your Holy Spirit so that I truly and completely belong to you...*

And God does answer our prayers and will send his Holy Spirit upon us.

Shall we see tongues of fire? Well maybe and maybe not. But the Spirit is not necessarily any less visibly tangibly, perceptibly present...

The Spirit comes in many ways - with many purposes - many gifts - and many jobs to do - but always in blessing...

I have seen and felt the Holy Spirit come on people - individuals and groups ... and I believe that many of you have too.

I have seen people “rest” or kind of faint in the Spirit. Or just become so still - so very still - that they do not move a muscle - as the peace of God rests upon them. The Spirit of Peace comes sometimes bringing just peace, and sometimes working a bit like an anaesthetic to allow God to work deeply bringing healing to bodies, minds, or memories.

I have known people find “an unusual” strength or courage in impossible situations as the Spirit came literally as their helper and comforter.

I have seen people receive a gift of tears as the Comforter came to release and wash away pent up grief and pain that they had been unable to find a way to express.

I have seen people receive a gift of joy and laughter - building faith and bringing hope in difficult times and filling a room with praise and thanksgiving in good times. I have seen people’s eyes and faces light up not only with their own smiles, their own joy and pleasure but also with a “heavenly light and joy” as they testify to what God has done for them.

I have seen the Spirit overshadow people in prayer - wrapping them in a great prayer blanket - as they pray and he prays with them and in them.

I have heard the Spirit give people just the right words in a really sensitive moment, words to bring healing and peace, words to bring justice but not offence, words for individuals

or words for groups. And I have seen people's surprise (and relief) as they realise they have been inspired with words they are certain they could never have thought of for themselves!

And often as the congregation bows its heads in prayer I have felt "a wave of the Spirit" sweep in so that we all seem to enter a still moment in time and space - so peaceful, so beautiful - that we almost dare not disturb it!

The Spirit - (we tend to think of him a bit like a tame dove or a homing pigeon - while our Celtic ancestors thought of him more as a wild goose!) - is not tame but he is always gentle and respectful. His purpose always for our good. For our good sometimes he does disturb us, prick our consciences, convict us - but only to draw us closer and deeper into the God we love, who is love.

Often in Church we sing:

Holy Spirit we welcome you  
Please accomplish in me - in us - today  
Some new work of loving grace we pray  
Unreservedly have your way  
Holy Spirit we welcome you.

It is a bold and a brave prayer because it is, it will be transformational, life changing, but only ever and always for the better.

Today, let us realise that we are called / chosen to be equipped/gifted and sent and let us allow that to happen. Let us allow ourselves (like the first apostles), to be equipped



and gifted, empowered and emboldened, enthused and energised as witnesses to what we have seen and heard...

Let us welcome and receive again the Holy Spirit...
